

KEY PROTECTION ISSUES

ISSUES AND GAPS RESPONSES Exclusion of assistance for IDPs who were not able to participate in the Kathanor. Lack of concrete data on home-based IDPs, thus, not prioritize IDP sharers at the TS were provided with assistance by the LGU ٠ for any interventions as compared to IDPs settled at TS. IDP Marawi. families who share with others at the TS are excluded for humanitarian assistance. Limited food supplies provided to IDPs. Food distributions had diminished unlike in previous months during the emergence of COVID-19 where several organizations distributed food packs to the people including the IDPs. Lack of livelihood. KEY PROTECTION ISSUES

ISSUES AND GAPS	RESPONSES
Limited access to health care services . Distance to and from of health units at the transitory sites is a big constraint. Problems on fare hike that affects the IDPs' access to the services.	 On access to health care services, barangay health workers and barangay nutrition scholars also provide support to the health needs of the IDPs settled at TS in their respective areas. The MSF has established health stations at the TS in Sagonsongan and Boganga. The Traffic Management Group of Marawi takes precedence over price or fare regulation as a result of the pandemic.
Tensions build-up among IDPs at the TS.	 Dialogues among IDPs facilitated by B/CLGU, CSWO, NHA, and TFBM. The IDP leaders are advised to communicate with Camp Administrators, NHA and CSWO for any problems encountered by the IDPs.
There are reported cases on illegal drug transactions at the TS such as selling of illegal drugs.	 The police officers conduct entrapment operations, however, it creates feelings of insecurities for some IDPs.
Lack of CCCM.	 There are camp administrators in each site whom the IDPs can communicate for any concerns. CSWO is coordinating NHA and TFBM to provide working space for the Camp Administrators who will be deployed at the TS.

Key Protection Updates Island Provinces (BaSulTa)

Tuburan Municipality, Basilan Province. The members of BPAT were ambushed by unidentified armed men in Sitio Babag, Barangay Sinulatan. The incident has caused tension forcing **10 families (approximately 50 individuals) to flee their homes but have returned on the same day after the tension was pacified**. (*26 August 2020*)

□ Tipo-tipo Municipality, Basilan Province. Approximately 207 families (1,035 individuals) were forced to flee their homes in Barangay Bohe Lebbung due to an armed encounter caused by a personal dispute between members of CAFGU and BPAT. (12 August 2020) Patikul Municipality, Sulu Province. The Philippine Army clashed with the Abu Sayyaf Group in Sitio Butong, Barangay Kabbon Takas. The residents of the said village have been protractedly displaced since 2017, with approximately 125 families (625 individuals) temporary sheltered in the adjacent communities. (29 August 2020)
