

Key Protection Update Maguindanao Province

Status of Disaster/Emergency in Maguindanao:

> The province of Maguindanao have been experiencing isolated rain showers due to localized thunderstorm since the start of the month and given its geographical situation as the catch basin for the downpour of upstream water that resulted to the flooding incident in the province.

> Since October 13, 2020, there were 20 municipalities and 168 barangays that were affected by flood and over 69,000 families or 346,580 individuals were declared affected. Though, only few families fled away from their houses and seek refuge in the nearby barangays but they return back after the flood subsided.

> To date, as water subsided, the number of flood affected municipalities decreased and so with the number of the affected families. There was a decrease from 19 to 8 municipalities and from 69, 316 flood affected families to 12, 643 affected families with 63,215 individuals.

> On November 7, 2020- heavy rain started to pour in the municipality of South Upi that caused flash flood especially in the low lying areas of Sitio Gila-Gila, Brgy. Kuya, South Upi. Heavy rains resulted to the clogging of canals due to drowned trees/lumber that exacerbated the situation. This affected about 126 families. The LGU is ready to provide relief goods should situation continue.

No casualties, no injured and no damaged houses was reported. No major damage on properties or agricultural products except to some market goods which got wet.

At around 8 pm of the same date, the flood subsided. The BLGU and MDRRMO continued to declogged the canal and work on the clearing, monitoring and assessment continues.

Status of Disaster/Emergency in Maguindanao:

> Meanwhile, another series of armed conflict tensions brought by the feuding families/clans in Brgy. Muslim, Maguindanao last Sunday, November 8, 2020. According to the report, around 7:30 in the morning, hundred of families were forced to flee their homes and seek refuge to different locations (Brgy. North Binangga and Katibpuan, Talayan and Brgy. Sampao, Guindulungan.

> Accordingly the tensions between these feuding families/clans had been on and off for the last two years due to the absence of durable solutions. There are more or less 300 families in Brgy. Muslim that fled during the tensions and hundreds of families in this area are experiencing repeatable displacement because of the emerging tension between these feuding families/clans.

> Validation resulted to the presence of 98 IDP families from Brgy. Muslim and Lower Katibpuan who sought refuge at brgy. North Binangga, Talayan while 350 IDP families from Brgy. Muslim, Guindulungan and Brgy Katibpuan Talayan went to Sitio Dam, Brgy, Sampao, Guindlungan.

> Aside from this incident, 308 families in Brgy. Ahan, Guindulungan are still staying in the evacuation center due the past conflict.

> Likewise, 318 IDP families in two (2) evacuation center and housebased are still staying at Brgy. Saniag and Salman, Ampatuan.

> A UXO rocket launcher was recovered in Brgy. Tuka, Sultan Mastura on November 8, 2020. A certain Andamen, Brgy. Kagawad of Brgy. Tuka had called the PNP Sultan Mastura and informed them that their carpenter had excavated a portion of a lot where they are working. The EOD Personnel led by PLT Roger C. Maganis blasted the said UXO.

Key Protection Update Basilan Province

DISPLACEMENT UPDATE

- 20 families who were displaced due to family feud have returned home while 50 families opted to stay until the conflict between the opposing parties is resolved. (Hadji Mohammad Ajul Municipality)
- □ 9 of the 20 families who were displaced due to firefight between AFP and undetermined armed group have returned home, the remaining 11 families are still displaced and are with their relatives. (*Brgy. Upper Cabengbeng, Sumisip Municipality*)
- There is decreased in the number of IDPs that were protractedly displaced as a result of gradual return to their places of origin.

COVID-19 UPDATES

□ As of 7 November 2020, there are 336 total confirmed cases of COVID-19 in Basilan Province. Of the total number, there are 284 recoveries, 10 deaths and 42 active cases. There are 196 suspect cases. (*This includes data of Isabela City*)

Persisting needs of the IDPs

Threats from both warring parties continue to create fears. There is likelihood that the families of the victims and the perpetrator might cross paths because they are neighbours and reside in the same town. Key Protection Update Sulu Province

DISPLACEMENT OVERVIEW IN SULU PROVINCE

No new displacement.

- Out of the 1,078 displaced families, 215 families (approximately 1, 045 individuals) returned to their places of origin. It was facilitated by a joint effort of the PLGU, MLGU, AFP, NCMF, BFP, MSSD, RHU, IRDT and other partners.
- Another 180 families are schedule to return this 12 November 2020. Any assistance will be appreciated by the returning families.



DISPLACEMENT OVERVIEW IN SULU PROVINCE

Assistance extended to the IDPs:

- Core relief items (UNHCR)
- o 2 sacks of rice, food packs and G.I. sheet (*Provincial LGU*)

- Constructed comfort rooms and hand washing facility
- Free haircut and medical mission (security sectors)


