

DISPLACEMENT OVERVIEW IN BARMM



Key Protection Update Maguindanao Province

Status of Disaster/Emergency in Maguindanao:

> The province of Maguindanao had experienced isolated rain showers due to localized thunderstorm this month of October and November that caused flood in the 22 municipalities of the province and given its geographical situation as the catch basin for the downpour of upstream water.

> To date, as the flood subsided, there are still four (4) municipalities with 21 barangays are still under flooded with 7130 flood affected families and 35, 650 individuals.

> Series of relief distributions were already conducted by different agencies, NGOs and INGOs. The latest was the relief distribution in Datu Anggal Midtimbang, wherein 508 flood affected families were provided 25 kilos of rice each.

 Meanwhile, municipality of Datu Saudi Ampatuan had experience huricane of strong wind last November 21, 2020 wherein 116 houses, 2 madrasah and 1 mosque were damaged.
 No reported casualties and displaced families were reported.

> Datu Anggal Midtimbang also experienced huricane and 6 houses were damaged.

Status of Disaster/Emergency in Maguindanao:

> The family feud in barangay Muslim had brought tensions to all residents of Brgy. Muslim, Guindulungan and Upper Katibpuan, Talayan. To date, there were 321 IDP families seek refuge in Brgy. Sampao, Guindulungan and 297 IDP families who are now staying in the evacuation center in Brgy. North Binangga, Talayan.

> Both MSWOs of Talayan and Guindulungan had already conducted actual validation and assessment in their respective evacuation centers. MSSD-Maguindanao had already provided food packs in both evacuation centers. There were 321 families were provided welfare goods EC in Brgy. Sampao, Guindulungan and a total of 297 IDP families were also provided welfare goods in EC of Brgy. North Binangga, Talayan on November 13 and November 21, 2020.

> The 318 IDP families in Brgy. Ahan, Guindulungan had already return home last week November 12, 2020.

>308 IDP families in two (2) evacuation center and housebased are still staying at Brgy. Saniag and Salman, Ampatuan.

> Another fire fight between feuding families occurred in brgy. Macabiso, Sultan Mastura Maguindanao wherein 70 IDP families with total dependents of 232 seek refuge at the municipal gymnasium last November 22, 2020.

The MSWO with the assistance of MLGU/ BLGU had fed the 70 IDP families thru community kitchen since yesterday until lunch time of November 23, 2020.

The 70 IDP families had already returned to their residences yesterday, November 23, 2020.

Key Protection Update Basilan Province

DISPLACEMENT UPDATE:

- 10 of the 15 families that remain displaced in Unkaya Pukan Municipality have returned to their habitual residences.
- New displacement in Brgy. Langong, Mohammad Ajul Municipality due to conflict between members of the MILF and unidentified armed group. Approximately 45 families (255 individuals) were displaced on 20 November 2020
- Potential GCRV case in Ungkaya Pukan Mnicipality: three (3) young minors aged 11, 12 and 15 respectively.

COVID-19 UPDATE:

 As of 21 November 2020, there are 356 total confirmed cases of COVID-19 in Basilan Province. Of the total number, there are 321 recoveries, 10 deaths and 25 active cases. There are 97 suspect cases. (This includes data of Isabela City)

Key Protection Update Sulu Province

- □ No new displacement.
- Additional 211 IDP families (approximately 1,100 individuals) from Kabbon Takas Municipality have returned to their places of origin on 20 November 2020. This is part of the Balik Barangay Program which was facilitated by the joint effort of the P/MLGUs, AFP, NCMF, BFP, DPWH, MSSD, RHU, IRDT-UNHCR and other partners.



Assistance and services extended to the IDPs:

- Core Relief Items such as mats, tarpaulins, solar lamps, mosquito nets and hygiene kits from UNHCR
- 1 sack of rice, food packs, rubber shoes and 5,000 cash assistance from PLGU
- 1 sack of rice, vegetable seeds and G.I sheets for 211 families from MLGU
- 20ltrs galloon and UNHCR fleece blankets provided by the MSSD
- Slippers and feedings from Bansag Babae
- Toys from concern citizens
- Assorted Medicines from MARSOC

Assistance and services extended to the IDPs:

- Pail and kitchen utensils from Asia Amerika Initiatives
- Medical outreach from AFP
- Vaccines from RHU-Patikul
- On going construction of road by DPWH
- On going construction of water system by PLGU
- Constructed public comfort room and hand washing facility
- Signing of peoples' peace covenant
- 420 G.I. sheets for the repair of damaged school building

Other Updates

- On 12 November 2020, there were 151 ReFS (6th Batch) from Sarawak, Malaysia who have arrived in Zamboanga City of which 96 are from BARMM
- 50 ReFS arrived in Sulu on 17 November 2020

- WASH: water insufficiency in Rorogagus and Sagonsongan Areas
- WASH: full septic tanks in Sagonsongan Areas
- Issues on drainage canal that are not covered which may expose children and other vulnerable group with risk and danger
- IDPs' access to food and sustainable livelihood assistance



- 55 families still displaced
- Needs:
 - Shelter
 - Improvement of water source and water stat
 - Installation of gender segregated toilets
 - Food assistance




